Entrance-Level Training Waiver Requests

The MD Police & Correctional Training Commissions (PCTC) Comparative Compliance Training Course is an abbreviated entrance-level training program designed for previously certified Maryland police officers who have been separated from law enforcement between 3 and 5 years, and non-Maryland officers who completed an acceptable entrance-level training program in another state or through the federal government.

An agency requesting a waiver of entrance-level training from the Police Training and Standards Commission (Commission) on behalf of an individual must submit the entrance-level training curriculum/course outline and the number of hours of the course (COMAR 12.04.01.14E(2)) to the Director of Law Enforcement Training as listed on the PCTC Contact List. All submissions must be made by an agency representative and will not be accepted from individual applicants.

<u>COMAR</u> 12.04.01.14E outlines the minimum requirements needed to grant a waiver of entrance-level training. Two main areas are reviewed in this process: hours and curriculum.

The review will compare the applicant's approved academy hours with the amount of Maryland academy hours required by regulation at the time of academy attendance as detailed below. For example, if the officer graduated from entrance-level training on June 6, 1996, the 600-hour mandate would be used.

Minimum Hours for Police Entrance-Level Training	
January 1975 - November 1975	259 hours
November 1975 - June 1980	350 hours
June 1980 - March 1983	385 hours
March 1983 - May 1995	400 hours
May 1995 - June 2009	600 hours
July 2009 – July 2023	750 hours
August 2023 - present	850 hours

The minimum hour requirement includes entrance-level firearms training and qualifications but does not include field training. If field training is included in the overall total hours, those hours are subtracted.

Topics taught during the applicant's in-service training may be considered toward the minimum academy hourly requirement. An annual repetitive topical area may only be considered once.

Specialized training received during the applicant's career that is relevant to the topical areas may be considered toward the minimum academy hourly requirement.

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In addition to the hours of training, a complete review of the entrance-level training curriculum is conducted. The curriculum must meet the enumerated topics in <u>COMAR</u> 12.04.01.09C as detailed below.

Entrance-level firearms training and qualification under <u>COMAR</u> 12.04.02 can be completed by the hiring agency. If the individual previously completed entrance-level firearms training that is equivalent to the entrance-level firearms training required under <u>COMAR</u> 12.04.02 for the agency-approved firearm and has received a waiver from the Commission, the individual shall be required to complete annual firearms classroom instruction and training and qualification <u>COMAR</u> 12.04.02.

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
