



# Critical Employee Emergency Planning

**Course Description:** The one-day training provides key information that employers, employees and their families must have to prepare for any of the 15 Department of Homeland Security planning scenarios which include natural disasters and nuclear, biological, chemical, radiological, and cyber attacks.

The topics discussed include: Preparing first responders to care for their families while remaining “on the job” through evacuation, quarantine, and other critical incidents; Developing a personal communications plan and procedures; Identifying and entering into mutual aid relationships with “sister” agencies; and Providing information on federal and non-profit sector support services available for prevention, protection, response and recovery.

**Target Audience:** Managers, Planners, Trainers, and Persons with Policy Responsibility in Public Safety (Law Enforcement, Fire, EMS, Rescue), Medical Community, Schools, Banking and Finance, Chemical and Industrial Facilities, Utilities, Food and Agriculture, National Monuments, Postal and Shipping, Telecommunications, Transportation, and Defense Industries.
