Workshop #2 – Case Study Presentation- Kidnapping and murder of a suspected MS 13 member by 11 18th Street members - Jan 2009

Presenter: Jeffrey T. Wennar

Jeffrey Wennar has been practicing law since 1979. He began his legal career as an Assistant State's Attorney in Prince George's County, Maryland. In August 2001 he joined the Montgomery County State's Attorney's Office as the Gang Prosecutor. In 1993 Governor Schaefer appointed Mr. Wennar to the Governor's Executive Advisory Council which resulted in "A Report on Gang Violence in Maryland,"

In 1995 he was recognized by Federal Bureau of Investigation for his successful prosecution of the Hester drug gang. In 2003 and 2004 Mr. Wennar received the prestigious Frederic Milton Thrasher Award, from the National Gang Crime Research Center, for superior community service. Mr. Wennar is a member of the Executive Board of the Mid Atlantic Gang Investigators Network, and is the Legislative Chair for the National Alliance of Gang Investigators Associations. Mr. Wennar is currently an Adjunct Professor at American University and Washington College of Law where he developed and teaches an advanced trial advocacy class focusing on prosecuting gang homicides.

Workshop #3 – “Professional Ethics *"The Elevator Principle"*”

Steven Bodway began his law enforcement career in 1973 as a Military Policeman in the U.S. Army. Over the last 27 years, Steve has progressed through a range of ranks and assignments with the Harford County Sheriff's Office starting with patrol duties, motor patrol, accident reconstruction, criminal investigations, Internal affairs, Watch Commander, Commander of a multi-jurisdictional Task Force, Division Commander responsible for the Court system and is currently the Bureau Commander of Administration. Major Bodway has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Baltimore and holds a Masters of Science degree from Johns Hopkins University. In 1995, Major Bodway received his ethics instructor training from the Southwestern Law Enforcement Institute which is now known as the Center for Law Enforcement Ethic, headquartered in Plano, Texas.
