From the Office of the Executive Director

HAVING AN IMPACT

For many years I have felt that public safety is a noble profession. Like a "vocation", it is a life changing commitment to service for the benefit of others so that their lives may be better.

Even within the varying assignments of public safety I believe there are levels and layers. High among these is the public safety trainer. Trainers have the unique opportunity to impact on the profession and to leave an enduring legacy within their respective organizations. Trainers have been selected by their superiors to be the model, mentor, guide and teacher for others, and for future generations of officers. They have a subtle but undeniable influence on how law enforcement and correctional services are performed; not only by the content of their lesson plans, but by their very selves.

There is another sub-set of public safety officers who step out of the traditional duties and responsibilities for their profession. The DARE officers. These men and women are re-dedicated to a mission of influencing children to resist the temptations of drug use. They have the unenviable task of attempting to convey a message to these teens and sub-teens that will help them make the correct life-style choices months and years later. Making the job even harder is the fact that they may never see the fruits of their labors. Children who, at some future point in their lives, reflect on the DARE message and turn away from drugs, rarely return to their DARE officer with a message of affirmation. DARE officers are motivated solely by faith and confidence that their message and their mission are the right ones.

When you combine the vocational commitment of a police officer, the attributes of a trainer and the conviction of the DARE officer, you get Sergeant Gary Chatfield.

Gary Chatfield joined the Maryland State Police in 1977 in response to the same "calling" as most police officers. In 1988 he became a DARE officer. With the support of a federal grant, in 1994 the Police and Correctional Training Commissions' Community Crime Prevention Unit was able to contract with the Maryland State Police for Corporal Gary Chatfield to serve as the Maryland State DARE Coordinator. In that capacity, Gary has been responsible for overseeing the training and re-training of hundreds of DARE officers, negotiating with school principals, administrators, councils and boards to secure the DARE program in the students' curricula and continually convince police chiefs and sheriffs of the cost effectiveness of dedicating their officers to the DARE mission.

HAVING AN IMPACT

In all these, Gary has been remarkably and commendably successful.

Gary's dedication to DARE and credibility with educators and law enforcement has been underscored by his involvement with DARE America, the national administrators of the DARE program. Serving on the Board of Directors and a major contributor to curriculum development and re-development efforts, Gary is a nationally recognized authority on DARE.

As the mission and impact of DARE have found attention in other nations experiencing the crisis of drugs with their own youth, Gary and his team of DARE trainers have gone as missionaries and teachers to Newfoundland and Saskatchewan Canada and Brazil with the DARE philosophy and curriculum. Each time they have left behind the structure and mechanism to train more local DARE officers how to assist children to resist drugs.

On March 1st Gary Chatfield is retiring from the Maryland State Police, from the Commissions' Community Crime Prevention Unit and from the post as State DARE Coordinator. He leaves behind a network of DARE trainers committed to the same life-saving mission to which he has been committed. He leaves behind legion of unseen, unknown children whose lives he has directly or indirectly influenced. He leaves behind friends and associates who respect him and love him and who will miss him. The tributes to Gary Chatfield will be and should be numerous. But they will not all be plaques or proclamations. I believe the greatest recognition for Gary Chatfield, for all the good that he has done and the legacy that he has established, will not be realized until he receives his final reward... and it will be everlasting.

LEGAL NOTES

U.S. SUPREME COURT

Interrogations.

After a federal grand jury indicted John Fellers on drug charges, police went to his home with an arrest warrant. Fellers invited the police inside. They advised Fellers they had come to discuss his involvement in drugs, and told him he had been indicted and they had a warrant for his arrest. They also told Fellers the indictment referred to his involvement with some people, 4 of whom they named. Fellers told the officers he knew the 4 people and had used drugs with them. After being in Fellers' home about 15 minutes, police took him to jail, and gave him his *Miranda* rights for the first time. Fellers signed a *Miranda* waiver, and reiterated his earlier incriminating statements and made more incriminating statements.

Fellers filed a motion to suppress the statements he made at his home and at the jail, arguing his 6th Amendment right to counsel was violated. The District Court suppressed the unwarned statements Fellers made at his home, but let the other statements into evidence; Fellers was convicted. The 8th Circuit Court affirmed, ruling his rights were not violated. But a unanimous Supreme Court reversed. The 6th Amendment right to counsel is triggered after judicial proceedings have been initiated, whether by formal charge, preliminary hearing, indictment, information, or arraignment. An accused is denied the right to counsel when police deliberately elicit incriminating statements from him after he has been indicted and in the absence of counsel, and the evidence of his statements are used against him at trial. The Court held there was no question police "deliberately elicited" information from Fellers - when they got to his house they told him they had come to discuss his involvement in drugs. And because that discussion took place after Fellers was indicted, but without counsel and without any waiver of his 6th Amendment rights, the courts below should not have ruled that his rights were not violated when his jailhouse statements were admitted at trial. Remanded for ruling on whether the jailhouse statements are admissible after a *Miranda* waiver, even though the earlier incriminating statements violated the 6th Amendment. *Fellers v. U.S.*, __S.Ct.__, (2004 WL 111410).

Checkpoints.

Police set up a highway checkpoint to obtain information from motorists about a fatal hit-and-run that occurred a week earlier at about the same place and time. Police stopped each car for 10-15 seconds, asked the occupants if they had seen anything, and gave each driver a flyer describing the accident and requesting information. As Robert Lidster approached the check-

point, his car swerved and he almost hit an officer. The officer smelled alcohol on Lidster's breath. Another officer gave him a sobriety test, and then arrested him; he was eventually convicted of DUI. Lidster challenged his conviction, arguing the evidence against him was obtained through the use of a checkpoint stop that violated the 4th Amendment under *Indianapolis v. Edmond*, 531 U.S. 32 (2000). The trial court disagreed, but the appeals courts held the stop was unconstitutional.

The Supreme Court held the checkpoint here did not violate the 4th Amendment. In *Edmond*, police set up a checkpoint to find evidence of drug crimes committed by persons in cars, and the Court held that the 4th Amendment generally forbids police from making stops at checkpoints set up for 'general crime control' purposes, without individualized suspicion. The Court held *Edmond* did not apply to this case, because *Edmond* did not deal with an information-seeking stop. The checkpoint here was not intended to find evidence of car occupants committing crimes, but instead for police to ask members of the public for help in solving a crime that was probably committed by others. The Court noted the 4th Amendment does not treat a motorist's car as his castle, and special law enforcement concerns will sometimes justify highway stops without individualized suspicion (e.g., sobriety and Border Patrol checkpoints). "Like certain other forms of police activity, say, crowd control or public safety, an information-seeking stop is not the kind of event that involves suspicion, or lack of suspicion, of the relevant individual." The Court also noted that information-seeking stops are less likely to provoke anxiety or be intrusive, and the law usually permits police to ask the public for voluntary cooperation in crime investigation. The Court held the stop was constitutional because: public concern was grave (fatal accident); police needed information about the perpetrator of a specific crime (not general crime control); it was tailored to the specific investigation (1 week later, same time of day); and only a few seconds of interference with motorists. *Illinois v. Lidster*, __S.Ct.__ (2004 WL 51006).

Traffic stops - probable cause to arrest vehicle's occupants.

The Supreme Court reviewed a Maryland case to decide whether police had probable cause to arrest a front-seat passenger of a car where drugs and cash were found. Joseph Pringle was a passenger in the front seat of a car stopped by police for speeding and seat belt violation; another passenger rode in the back. After police gave the driver an oral warning, they asked for and received the driver's consent to search the car. Police recovered a large amount of cash from the glove box and 5 plastic baggies of cocaine from the backseat armrest. Police told the men unless someone confessed, they would all be arrested. Nobody confessed, and all 3 were arrested. About 2 hours later, police gave Pringle his *Miranda* rights and interviewed him; Pringle gave a written confession that the drugs were

his. Pringle moved to suppress the confession, but the motion was denied, and he was convicted of CDS offenses. The Court of Special Appeals affirmed, but the Court of Appeals reversed, holding that merely finding cocaine in the back armrest when Pringle was a front seat passenger in a car being driven by its owner did not give police sufficient probable cause to arrest Pringle for possession.

The Supreme Court reversed. Maryland law and the 4th Amendment authorize police to make warrantless arrests when they have probable cause to believe a felony has been committed. Here, police had probable cause to believe any or all 3 of the car's occupants had knowledge of, and exercised control over, the drugs. A reasonable officer could conclude there was probable cause to believe Pringle committed the crime of possession of cocaine, either solely or jointly. The Court rejected Pringle's 'guilt by association' argument, noting that the 3 men were in a small automobile, not a large public place, so it was reasonable for police to infer a common enterprise among them. *Maryland v. Pringle*, __S.Ct.__ (2003 WL 22938461).

MARYLAND

Public Information Act - 2 cases.

For purposes of the Public Information Act, a record or piece of public information can be made confidential only by: State or federal statute or a regulation issued under the statute that has the force of law; rule adopted by the Maryland Court of Appeals; or court order. The General Assembly did not intend to allow counties, by local law or ordinance, to create additional exemptions or grounds for refusing to disclose information the PIA requires to be disclosed. *Police Patrol Security Systems, Inc. v. Prince George's County*, __Md.__ (2003 WL 22965251).

One provision of the PIA provides that custodians of records may deny requests for records pertaining to investigations conducted by a police department, if the custodian believes disclosure of the public records would be contrary to the public interest. State Gov't Art., §10-618(f)(1)(i). There is no "catchall" public interest exemption from disclosing records. The PIA does not require disclosure of investigatory police reports compiled for law enforcement purposes to a defendant in a *pending* criminal proceeding. But where the police investigation is closed and there is no danger that disclosure would interfere with ongoing law enforcement proceedings, the custodian must provide a particularized factual basis for a "public interest" denial. *City of Frederick v. Trey, et al.*, __Md.App.__ (2004 WL 162933) (custodian improperly denied requests for access to 'black book' seized from person who had already pleaded guilty to running a house of prostitution).

4th Amendment - strip searches. Chris Nieves was arrested for giving a police officer false information, and charged with traffic violations. Upon arriv-

ing at the station, a lieutenant saw Nieves and said he knew him from prior events involving a drug task force. Based on his knowledge of Nieves' prior drug involvement, the lieutenant ordered that Nieves be strip searched. The strip search revealed drugs; Nieves was ultimately convicted of drug offenses.

Nieves challenged the conviction by arguing the strip search was unconstitutional because it was based solely on his past criminal arrest record for drug offenses, and not on a reasonable articulable suspicion that he possessed contraband at the time of the search. The trial court disagreed, but the Court of Special Appeals agreed. The search incident to arrest exception to the 4th Amendment's warrant requirement does not give police unfettered access to search arrestees when and how they choose. There is a presumption against strip searching for minor or traffic offenses, without some reasonable suspicion the arrestee possesses contraband or weapons. The lieutenant's knowledge of Nieves' prior drug history was insufficient, without more, to justify the strip search. *Nieves v. State*, __Md.App.__ (2003 WL 23004983).

Did you know that...? In 2002, the General Assembly passed the Safe Haven Act, which provides civil and criminal immunity for an individual who leaves an unharmed newborn with a responsible adult. Courts & Jud. Proc. Art., §5-641. A person with whom a newborn is left must take the newborn to a hospital or another facility that is designated by regulation. Regulations implementing the Act took effect November 2003, and designate those facilities as "a hospital, *State police barracks, or local police department.*" COMAR .07.02.27.02 (emph. added). Police may wish to consider implementing departmental policy to address this law and regulation.

2002-2003 ANNUAL REPORT:

The Maryland D.A.R.E. Coordinator's Office has published the 2002-2003 Annual Report on Drug Abuse Resistance Education. Statistics for this are obtained from the Statistical Data Report, Instructor Appraisal Form, and School Administrator's Appraisal Form, which are distributed to D.A.R.E. Officers and schools in Maryland that offer the D.A.R.E. Program. Completing its 17th year in Maryland, D.A.R.E. is still the number one school-based drug and violence prevention education program in use worldwide. 95 officers from 31 law enforcement agencies reported delivering D.A.R.E. programs to 45,728 students in 20 Maryland counties.

An overall satisfaction rating of 99.6% with the programs and officers on campus was reported by school administrators. Classroom teachers rated the officers' presence and performance in the classroom as a role model and educator with a rating of 97% as

being effective, highly effective, or outstanding. These in-depth appraisals document the job quality and work ethic of local officers, and reflect positively upon their local agencies. Student testing revealed an average increase of 20% between the pre- and post-test scores, indicating an increase in knowledge base.

ADVANCED AND SPECIALIZED TRAINING

Calling Collaborative Supervision and Focused Enforcement (C-SAFE) an essential element of his Public Safety and Safer Neighborhoods Pillar, Governor Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr. commended team members and supervisors attending C-SAFE Academy for their dedication to the initiative and to the public safety of all Marylanders. Developed and taught by members of MPCTC's Advanced and Specialized Training Unit, C-SAFE Academy was a three-day intensive training for those who have joined C-SAFE teams statewide within the last year.

Over eighty people from the Department of Juvenile Services, Division of Parole and Probation and law enforcement agencies joined representatives from detention centers, treatment providers and community groups to tackle diverse topics such as C-SAFE policies and procedures, developing communication skills, integrating new members into C-SAFE teams and 'what works' strategies for offenders. The training included presentations from experts in mental health, victim services and substance abuse. The topics of crime mapping, nuisance abatement, offender employment and trauma treatment for offenders were tackled in small sessions so that attendees could take practical tips back to their jurisdictions.

ATTENTION LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS



BULLETIN: Be advised that MVA has been issuing a "15-Day Temporary Authority," also called "Temporary Registration," to vehicle owners. DO NOT issue a citation to a vehicle displaying a valid Temporary Authority/Registration EVEN IF the vehicle registration sticker is expired. The Temporary Authority/Registration is a white slip of paper the size of a store receipt. It may be

printed in either color or black-and-white. It is placed in the rear window of the vehicle until the owner receives a registration sticker by mail. If it cannot be practically displayed in the vehicle's rear window, the owner should place the Temporary Authority/Registration in the front window. It contains an EXPIRATION DATE and the vehicle Plate and Title numbers. Please go by the EXPIRATION DATE and honor any valid MVA Temporary Authority/Registration.



BULLETIN: Be advised that Maryland MVA now issues a Registration Card to vehicle owners who request one online (www.marylandmva.com) or at an MVA kiosk. The Registration Card is a white slip of paper the size of a store receipt. It may be printed in color or black-and-white. Due to privacy laws, the vehicle owner's name cannot be printed on the card, but all necessary vehicle information is

present. The Registration Card is only valid if the vehicle tags are valid. An online or kiosk Registration Card is a valid registration equivalent to the standard registration card received by mail.
