From the Office of the Executive Director

THE GIFTS THAT KEEP ON GIVING

The generosity of people continues to astound me. Last month I had the honor to accept from Governor Robert Ehrlich a plaque commemorating the support of members of the Police and Correctional Training Commissions to the victims of Hurricane Katrina. The goods collected at the Public Safety Education and Training Center as well as institutions in the Jessup, Hagerstown and Salisbury regions were transported by drivers from Maryland Correctional Enterprises to the Gulf-state victims. Regrettably, the needs of unfortunate victims do not come to a conclusion with the end of a charity campaign or pledge drive. That is one of the reasons the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services has instituted the Benevolence Fund. Created by the Building Employee Spirit as a Team (B.E.S.T.) Committee, this fund will be the official outreach to members of the Department who have suffered a personal loss. PCTC has already initiated several fund raiser activities in support of the Benevolence Fund. More are on the way.

All of these efforts reflect the good hearts and kind spirits of the members of this Agency-family. It is a pleasure to work among such compassionate people.

UPCOMING COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL CRIME PREVENTION TRAINING PROGRAMS – DATES AND LOCATIONS:

Dates and locations have been confirmed for MCCPI's Commercial and Residential Crime Prevention Training Programs, as follows:

Commercial Program: June 5-9, 2006 at McDaniel College in Westminster. This program has been approved for 29 hours of in-service credits.

Residential Programs: March 20-23, 2006 at the Public Safety Education and Training Center in Sykesville; April 3-6, 2006 at the Castle in the Sand in Ocean City; September 11-14, 2006 at Kennedy Krieger Institute in Baltimore City. CURRENT TRENDS CRIME PREVENTION TRAINING PROGRAMS:

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VIDEO-CONFERENCING

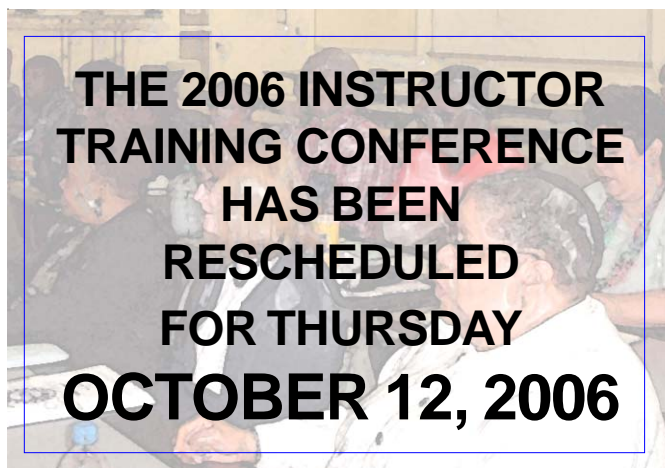
We are pleased to announce the availability of video-based teleconferencing at the Public Safety Education and Training Center.

LEGAL NOTES

Are police officers required to be “experts” to testify about reasonable suspicion? Kobie Matoumba was the right rear passenger in a car police stopped for speeding in Baltimore. The officer who approached the car on the right side saw Matoumba repeatedly look back at the cruiser while officers effected the stop, dip his right shoulder toward the floor as officers approached, put his right hand behind his back as police approached the car, maintain constant eye contact with police, and have visibly shaky hands. Police ordered everyone out of the car, and found a loaded gun on Matoumba when they frisked him. Matoumba was convicted of handgun possession, and appealed. The issue that reached the Court of Appeals was whether a police officer is required to be qualified as an expert when testifying at a suppression hearing as to his/her basis for conducting a *Terry* frisk.

The Court ruled that Maryland’s rules of evidence do not require police officers be qualified as experts in order to give an opinion on the basis for reasonable suspicion at a *suppression hearing*. But the Court was careful to distinguish this from a recent case (*Ragland v. State*, 385 Md. 706 (2005)), where it held that the rules of evidence generally do not allow police to testify at *trial* based on their specialized skills and knowledge unless they have been qualified as experts. *Matoumba v. State*, ___ Md. ___ (2006).*

Use of police department’s general orders at trial. Baltimore Police Department General Order on high-speed pursuit driving (11-90) required officers to bring their vehicles to a full stop when crossing intersections against traffic control devices. An officer who was responding to an emergency slowed down at an intersection where he had the red light, then proceeded through it believing the intersection was clear; however, his cruiser collided with a civilian’s van. The civilian brought a negligence/personal injury lawsuit against the officer and others. At trial, the civilian (plaintiff) introduced GO 11-90 into evidence. The jury returned a verdict in plaintiff’s favor for \$46,894.05. Defendants appealed, arguing GO 11-90 should not have been admitted at trial as evidence of the officer’s negligence because rules like GO 11-90 are discretionary and lack the force of law.

The Court affirmed the verdict, pointing out that because the Baltimore Police Commissioner promulgated GO 11-90 under his rule making authority, it is binding on all members of the Department. There is no flat prohibition against the introduction of police department regulations at trial, and many Maryland courts have used departmental regulations to evaluate whether an officer’s actions were reasonable. While the violation of a departmental regulation does not automatically establish that an officer was negligent, it is a factor for a judge or jury to consider in evaluating the officer’s conduct. GO 11-90 was properly introduced at trial. *Baltimore v. Hart*, ___Md.App. ___ (2006).*

Execution of arrest warrant - detention - mistaken identity. On a Friday around 5:00 p.m., police stopped Evelyn Dett for a traffic violation, and a routine record check showed an open warrant for Vanessa Hawkins aka Evelyn Dett. Police assumed Dett was the subject of the warrant and took her to Central Booking Intake Center (CBIC), which is operated by the State of Maryland. Dett’s prints showed a State Identification number (SID) different from Hawkins/Dett’s SID. Detention center staff flagged her record and generated an arrest information report showing her birthdate as different from Hawkins/Dett’s. Sometime Friday evening, CBIC staff prepared and filed a Problem Paperwork Notice noting 2 SIDs and indicating this would keep her from being released. Early Saturday morning, a record search showed discrepancies between Dett’s social security number, FBI number, prior contacts with CBIC, height, birthdate, and address, and Hawkins/Dett’s information. On Monday, a response to the Problem Paperwork Notice came back with the conclusion these are two different people. On Tuesday morning, staff contacted the circuit court, and Dett was released Tuesday afternoon. Dett sued the State, claiming it illegally detained her despite knowing she and Hawkins/Dett were not the same person. The State got the lawsuit dismissed on summary judgment when the circuit court agreed with its argument that Dett could only have been released per an order issued by the court, and the State had no duty to investigate whether she was actually the subject of the warrant.

The Court of Special Appeals reinstated the lawsuit, and the Court of Appeals affirmed. Detention is only authorized if there is a reasonable belief the detainee is the right person. The Court held the case should not have been dismissed before trial because there was competent evidence the State knew it had the wrong person as early as Saturday morning. Did the State have a duty to investigate whether the right person was detained? The Court noted that there may be no such duty, but once the State became aware of facts that convince them that the person they are holding is *not* the person they are authorized by the warrant...to hold, they must, as promptly as reasonably possible, take the necessary steps, through the appropriate administrative structure, to release the person and notify the court or other agency that issued the warrant....(1) that they have done so, and (2) why. *State v. Dett*, ___Md. ___ (2006).*

Deliberate indifference - 8th Amendment “right” to suicide precautions. After Thomas Lee Short was arrested for violating a protective order obtained by his wife, he was released and went to a motel where he became intoxicated and called his family several times saying he would commit suicide. Mrs. Short called local police, who arrested him for (again) violating the protective order. Pursuant to departmental policy for potentially suicidal inmates, deputies put him in the video-surveillance sick room and remove instrumentalities that are potentially suicidal (sheets, blankets, laces, etc.) and do periodic checks. Short committed suicide by hanging himself with his shoe laces sometime during an interval where deputies did not check him; his suicide was captured on camera. Short’s wife sued several deputies under 42 U.S.C. B1983 (constitutional rights violations), claiming the officers violated his 8th Amendment rights by showing deliberate indifference to the substantial risk he would commit suicide. The case reached the appeals court for the federal 4th Circuit.

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The Court held that the deputies officers should have gotten out of the case before trial because Short did not have an 8th Amendment right to have his them take precautions beyond merely placing him in a cell under video surveillance, and that the deputies' response to his suicide risk was sufficient and reasonable. However, the Court held that the case against the deputy in charge of video monitoring should go to trial. *Short v. Smoot, et al.*, ___F.3d ___ (4th Cir. 2006).*

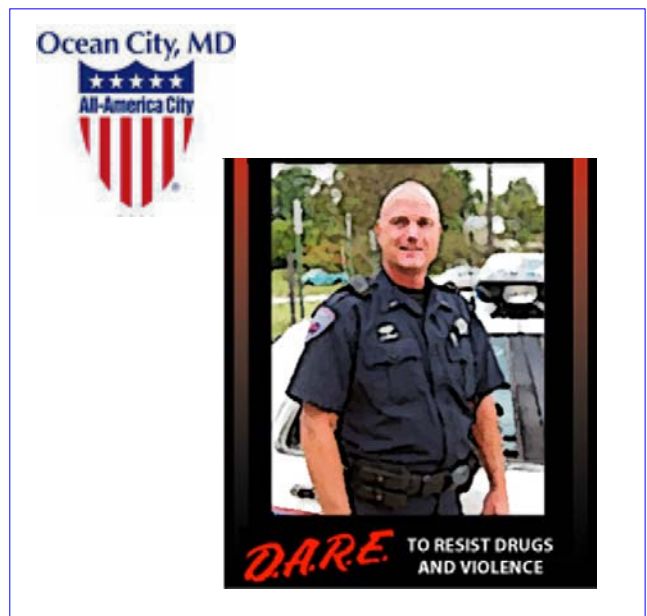
