From the Office of the Executive Director

TOO FEW MEDALS

On March 16, 2006 I had the opportunity to attend the U.S. Department of Justice ceremony for the awarding of the 2005 "Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor". This is the highest award conveyed by the federal government for extraordinary public safety service. The ceremony at the Department of Justice featured remarks by Attorney General Gonzales and followed a meeting between the recipients and President George Bush in the White House Rose Garden.

The Medal of Valor was conferred on three police officers (one posthumously), and two firefighters. Comments at the ceremony indicated that the review panel had approximately 130 nominations from which to select these recipients. While these comments went on to commend each of the nominees and describe the difficulty in making the final selection, I had a slightly different impression. I could not understand then, and still can not appreciate that there were only 130 nominations for outstanding/heroic public safety service from across the nation throughout 2005. I suspect there were significantly more. I further suspect that, for whatever reason, supervisors, administrators and/or public safety

executives did not take the time or effort to submit appropriate nominations. That is truly regrettable.

The national award is not unique. I have attended numerous award ceremonies across Maryland where associations and community groups have made a particular effort to honor an outstanding public safety officer. Sometimes the criteria calls for bravery or a life saving effort; sometimes it is community service or crime prevention. Invariably the results of these requests for nominees are the same. While a few outstanding and well-deserving candidates are submitted, it is too few, and many fewer than the number deserving of consideration.

There is little enough thanks for being a public safety officer; whether it is in law enforcement, corrections or the fire services. There are too few opportunities to tell these dedicated professionals that their efforts are perceived and appreciated. Supervisors need to realize that the recognition of outstanding performance is part of their job description. Chiefs and Sheriffs should make a particular effort to publicize exemplary conduct and the heroic actions of their offices. It's good for the department; it's good for the community; it's good for the profession and in a small way it makes up to the officer for many of the compensations the job doesn't offer.

I do appreciate the opportunity to add my applause and congratulations to the recipients of any of the national, state or local awards for public safety service. In the future I hope to hear that the review committee was deluged by the flood of nominations... a clear indication of the dedication and self-sacrifice of our men and women every day, in every Maryland community.

**CURRENT TRENDS CRIME PREVENTION
TRAINING PROGRAMS:**

MCCPI, in partnership with the Cumberland Police Department, will offer a two-day training for law enforcement officers entitled "Youth Crime Prevention: Focusing on Current Trends." The training provides up-to-date information on Gangs, Bullying, Sex Offenses and Youth, Sexual Predators on the Internet, and Drug Trends. **2006 GOVERNOR'S CRIME PREVENTION
AWARDS APPLICATIONS:**

The 27th Annual Governor's Crime Prevention Awards applications are currently being prepared. These contain eligibility information, criteria to be considered, and directions on how to apply for each of the awards. The six categories of awards include Law Enforcement Agencies, Officer, Community Groups/Organizations/Citizens, Proactive Crime Prevention Programs, Crime Prevention Achievers Award (for the performance of security surveys) and Outstanding Comprehensive Community-Based Anti-Crime Strategies in Maryland. Each of the six categories is exclusive from the other, and agencies may apply in one, several, or all categories. The awards are presented once a year and their purpose is to recognize outstanding contributions to the furtherance of crime prevention. Deadline for submission of award nominations is July 31, 2006.

In August, the 2006 Governor's Crime Prevention Awards Subcommittee will review nominations, select recipients, and assist in preparations for the Awards Ceremony, which is generally held in the fall. The Subcommittee is selected from members of the MCCPI Steering Committee and is regionally representative of Maryland.

MARYLAND STATE TRIAD NETWORK:

“Triad” stands for a three-way commitment among the chiefs of police in a county, the sheriff, and older or retired leaders. They agree to work together to reduce the criminal victimization of the elderly and enhance the delivery of law enforcement services to older persons.

The Maryland State Triad Network meets quarterly at the Heritage Office Complex in Annapolis, and meetings are open to the public. They feature a guest speaker as well as an opportunity for attendee information exchange. Remaining Network meetings for 2006 are set for June 21, September 20, and December 13. Plans are also underway for the 13th Annual State Triad Conference, which will co-sponsored by Baltimore City and Prince George’s County. This is scheduled for September 28 and 29, 2006 at the Comfort Inn in Bowie, Maryland.

MCGRUFF SECURITY AWARENESS PROGRAM:

For the past 26 years, the State of Maryland has honored law enforcement agencies, officers, citizens, and programs for their contributions to the furtherance of crime prevention programming in Maryland. MCCPI would like to take the opportunity to highlight some of these efforts through *Training Notes*. In this issue we are featuring the **McGruff Security Awareness Program** of the Kennedy Krieger Institute.

Kennedy Krieger Institute is comprised of eight facilities throughout the Baltimore area and one in Atlanta, Georgia and has over 2,000 employees. The McGruff Security Awareness Program was developed in response to a need to improve the prevention of suspicious activity and the reporting of thefts.

On a monthly basis, the Security Awareness Program introduced new tips and had McGruff visit the facilities to educate the staff. Each employee was required to wear and display a photo ID, and to stress the importance of this, a photo ID was even made for McGruff. A team approach to eliminating the opportunity for crime to happen was an important aspect of this program, and employee participation was emphasized.

Monthly activities included site visits by McGruff, a monthly e-mail on security awareness topics, and development of a monthly Security Awareness Bulletin. Also, training provided by the Maryland Community Crime Prevention Institute was incorporated into the program.

After the first year of the program, there was a 50% reduction in theft and a 600% increase in reporting of suspicious persons and activities. Continued staff participation in the prevention of criminal activities was apparent throughout the facility, and the program resulted in the staff working as a team to address security awareness/crime prevention issues.

LEGAL NOTES

U.S. SUPREME COURT

Refusal trumps consent. After a domestic dispute between Janet and Scott Rudolph, Scott hid their young son from Janet, who called police. She told the responding officer there was evidence in the house of Scott's drug use. Scott refused the officer's request for consent to search the house, but Janet consented. The officer searched the house and found evidence of drugs in Scott's bedroom. Scott moved to suppress the evidence as the fruit of a consent search authorized by his wife over his express refusal. The trial court denied the motion, and Scott was convicted. The case reached the U.S. Supreme Court, which ruled 5-3 in Scott's favor.

The Court held that a *physically present* co-occupant's express refusal of consent to search prevails over another occupant's consent, making the warrantless search unreasonable as to the objecting occupant. "Physical presence" is important because if a (potential) objector is not present to expressly object, he loses. Police are not required to go find a co-occupant who probably would object, but they are not permitted to remove the potentially objecting occupant to avoid the objection. The Court pointed out that the consenting occupant is certainly free to deliver evidence to police, and police are free to seek a search warrant; searches pursuant to warrant are preferable to warrantless searches anyhow. This decision does *not* apply to situations where police enter a home to accompany and protect a victim of domestic violence. *Georgia v. Rudolph*, __ U.S. __ (2006)(2006 WL 707380)

Anticipatory search warrants. An anticipatory search warrant was issued for Jeffrey Grubbs' home based on a federal officer's affidavit describing the residence and items to be seized - including child pornography - and explaining the warrant would not be executed until a parcel containing a child porn video was delivered and physically taken into Grubbs' home. The parcel was delivered, the warrant was executed, and Grubbs was indicted. He moved to suppress the evidence, arguing the warrant was defective because it was anticipatory and failed to state with particularity the triggering event for the warrant to be served. The trial court disagreed.

Grubbs was convicted, and the case ultimately reached the U.S. Supreme Court. The Court held that anticipatory warrants are not categorically unconstitutional. When an anticipatory warrant is issued, the fact that the contraband is not currently at the place described is immaterial so long as there is probable cause to believe it will be there when the warrant is executed. An anticipatory warrant is no different from a 'regular' warrant, because it requires a magistrate's determination

(1) that it is *now* probable that (2) contraband or evidence of crime will be on the described premises (3) when the warrant is executed. The Constitution requires that the place to be searched and the things to be seized be described in the warrant. The Court refused to expand these requirements to include 'triggers' for service of the warrant. *U.S. v. Grubbs*, __ U.S. __ (2006)(2006 WL 693453)

Still pending in the U.S. Supreme Court:

- Is a deputy district attorney's memo criticizing a sheriff a matter of public concern for purposes of the 1st Amendment's right to free speech? And is the District Attorney entitled to immunity for taking employment action against the memo's author? *Garcetti v. Ceballos*, 361 F.3d 1168 (9th Cir. 2004), *cert. granted*, 125 S.Ct. 1395 (2005) (argued 3/21/06)
- Is there an "emergency assistance" exception to the 4th Amendment's requirement that police obtain a warrant before entering a home? *Brigham City, et al. v. Stuart et al.*, 122 P.3d 506 (2005), *cert. granted*, 126 S.Ct. 979 (2006) (argued 4/24/06)

MARYLAND

Warrant execution - wrong address. While executing search warrants in a multi-room drug raid in a dormitory at the University of Maryland, University Police Detective Tou and other officers mistakenly entered the room 5108 instead of 5110. From Tou's position against the wall next to the room doors, the door frames obscured his view of the room numbers, which were above and to the left of each door. Room 5108's residents were cuffed and detained for about 2 minutes, and when the officers realized their mistake, they immediately released the residents.

One of room 5108's residents claimed he suffered post traumatic stress disorder from the experience, and sued Tou for constitutional rights violations. Tou moved for summary judgment, arguing his mistake was reasonable under the circumstances, and he was entitled to qualified immunity. The trial court ruled against Tou, who appealed to the 4th Circuit Court of Appeals. The 4th Circuit reversed, ruling Tou did not violate Mazuz's rights. Qualified immunity shields government officials performing discretionary functions from liability for civil damages if their conduct does not violate clearly established statutory or constitutional rights of which a reasonable person would have known. Tou "simply made an honest mistake based on his observation and perception of the room number as the raid unfolded" because he mistakenly associated number 5110 with room 5108. Under the circumstances of this raid, the entry into room 5108 and brief cuffing of its residents was not unreasonable. *Mazuz v. State, et. al.*, __ F.3d __ (4th Cir. 2006)(2006 WL 784952)

Frisking person who arrives during search warrant execution. Randy Brown walked up to a house and knocked on the door around 1:00 a.m. Unfortu-

nately for Brown, police were inside executing a search warrant. The detective who opened the door took Brown's arm and escorted him inside, and asked if he had any weapons or drugs. Brown replied he had a "quarter pound in his waist." The detective believed this to mean marijuana, and removed the bag from Brown's waist before cuffing him. At his suppression hearing, Brown argued the evidence should be suppressed as "fruit of the poisonous tree" because he should not have been forced to enter the house and police should have *Mirandized* him before asking if he had contraband. The trial court disagreed, and Brown was convicted.

The Court of Special Appeals affirmed, noting it was not clear that Brown's 1:00 a.m. arrival was unconnected with criminal activity, or that he presented no potential danger to police. Echoing a recent Maryland Court of Appeals case (*Cotton v. State*, 386 Md. 249 (2005)(no 4th Amendment violation to briefly detain individuals present on property subject to search warrant)), the Court refused to second-guess police by imagining something different they could have done here, like turn Brown away. Under these facts, it not unreasonable under the 4th Amendment for police to usher Brown into the house instead of turning him away. The Court also ruled police did not need to *Mirandize* Brown before asking if he had contraband. *Miranda* applies only to custodial interrogations, and when the detective asked about contraband, Brown was simply detained per *Terry*, not in custody. *Brown v. State*, __Md.App.__ (2006)(2006 WL 997257)

Police as expert witness at trial. Testimony based on special knowledge, skill, training, or experience is "expert testimony," and can only be given at trial by someone who has been qualified in court as an expert witness — same goes for police. A police officer cannot testify at trial, based on his experience and training, that he believed he saw a defendant participate in a drug buy, unless he has been qualified as an expert. *Ragland v. State*, 385 Md. 706 (2005)

Officer Bechtel responded to the home of a woman who had been attacked and wounded with a knife. Defendant's theory at trial was that the officer did a sloppy investigation, including failing to submit the knife for prints. Anticipating this, the officer testified "it's hard to get good prints off of blood," although he was never qualified as an expert witness. The defendant appealed his conviction, and the Court of Special Appeals decided the rule in *Ragland* did not apply here. The officer's testimony was not opinion evidence at all because it was not offered to establish any fact or essential element of the case itself, just to rebut the defendant's claims about the investigation. *Fullbright v. State*, __Md.App.__ (2006)(2006 WL 890835)

Probable cause to conduct field sobriety test ("FST"). Trooper Harris stopped Michael Blasi's car for unsafe lane change after watching it weave across the shoulder and dotted center lines, swerve, and fluctuate speed. The trooper smelled alcohol coming from

the vehicle, and then from Blasi when he stepped out of the car, and noticed Blasi's eyes were blood-shot and glassy and his speech was "absolutely slurred." Blasi admitted having a few drinks. Blasi consented to FSTs, on which he performed poorly. He was charged with DUI, and moved to suppress by arguing the stop was not based on probable cause, and FSTs constitute a search. The trial court disagreed, and Blasi was convicted.

The Court of Special Appeals affirmed. Blasi argued his case was like *Rowe v. State*, 363 Md. 424 (2001) (insufficient PC to stop driver for unsafe lane change for crossing shoulder line a few inches). But the Court ruled it was more like *Dowdy v. State*, 144 Md.App.155 (2001)(unsafe lane change where car swerved within lane and crossed broken lines into passing lane), and pointed out Blasi's swerving created a danger to drivers who may be in the passing lane. Along with fluctuating speed, this created sufficient PC for Trooper Harris to stop Blasi. For the 1st time, this Court held that FSTs constitute a search within the meaning of the 4th Amendment. Unlike aspects of yourself normally held out to the public (speech, height, weight, smell), the administration of FSTs during a traffic stop exposes parts of yourself not otherwise publicly observable, because information exposed during FSTs may reveal private facts about physical or psychological conditions. By the time police request a driver to submit to FSTs, the driver is already lawfully stopped, and police may require the driver to provide license/registration, get out of the car, etc. So because FSTs are short, limited intrusions, the Court analogized them to *Terry* stop/frisks, and held that although the administration of FSTs during a valid traffic stop is a search, it must be supported by reasonable suspicion, rather than full probable cause. *Blasi v. State*, __Md.App.__ (2006)(2006 WL 508646)

K-9's nose through open window. K-9 Bruno and his handler responded to a Chevy Blazer lawfully stopped by Maryland State Police Sgt. Mike Lewis. While Bruno circled the Blazer, he jumped up at the driver's side door and put his nose through the open window, then alerted for the presence of drugs. Over 11 pounds of cocaine were found in the vehicle, and driver Oscar Cruz was arrested. Cruz argued the drugs should be suppressed because Bruno put his nose through the open window and exceeded the permissible scope of an exterior K-9 scan. The circuit disagreed, and Cruz appealed. The Court of Special Appeals held the K-9 scan was lawful. Bruno's brief and instinctive intrusion into the open window did not transform the scan into an illegal interior search. Cruz had no privacy interest in the odor of cocaine emanating from the car, which Bruno detected from 'public airspace.' The Court noted the result may be different if Bruno's handler had opened the car window or encouraged Bruno to jump up to the window. *Cruz v. State*, __Md.App.__ (2006)(2006 WL 861064)

Admissibility of Comparative Bullet Lead Analysis ("CBLA"). Evidence based on a new scientific process is inadmissible in court unless the process is generally accepted by the relevant scientific community. Maryland's highest court has ruled that CBLA evidence is not admissible under this standard because there are genuine significant controversies within the scientific community about the reliability and validity the process CBLA uses to compare the lead in bullets. *Clemons v. State*, __Md.__ (2006)(2006 WL 1007644) FYI: For those with technical interests, this opinion contains a thorough description of the CBLA process.
