

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE

LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE PROGRAM

This program offers public safety executives the opportunity to interact with prominent authorities in diverse fields such as business and industry, health, education, human services, technology, and others. This nine-month program (September through June) consists of an overnight retreat, a one-day session per month and a formal graduation ceremony.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER PROGRAMS

These programs were developed to assist top executives in managing their respective public safety agencies. The Police Executive Officer Program is four days in length and the Correctional Executive Officer Programs are two and three days in length. The topics are specific to Maryland requirements and include presentations on the Training Commissions, performance management, ethics, liability issues, media relations, standards, policies and procedures, and others.

CAREER TRACK CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

This professional development program is specifically designed for public safety professionals who desire to upgrade their leadership skills in their occupational specialty and to enhance their overall performance. It's designed for optimum agency and individual customization. Agencies and/or individuals may select the particular career-track-courses they need. This process enables individuals to learn new skill sets at a personally controlled pace. Participants are offered a new and better way of learning through a structured yet flexible curriculum.

FIRST LINE ADMINISTRATOR TRAINING PROGRAM (2 weeks)

Fee: \$150

This is a 10 day program required by the Police and Correctional Training Commissions for all police and correctional personnel assigned or promoted into their department's first line administrator rank. In addition to meeting the requirements established in C.O.M.A.R., this program is designed to give students the basic skills they will need to function successfully in their role as first line administrator. All sessions will be held at the Public Safety and Education Training Center in Sykesville with a maximum of 24 participants.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE

FIRST LINE SUPERVISOR TRAINING PROGRAM (2 weeks)

Fee: \$150

This 10 day program is suitable for both law enforcement and correctional officers and includes interactive, problem solving exercises focusing on the fundamental skills required of all first line supervisors. The program offers topic specific practical exercises, which staff believe will provide a “hands on” approach to supervision. All programs fulfill MPCTC mandated requirements. Exercises are tailored to meet the needs and expectations of each class with examples drawn from both disciplines. Since this is a combined law enforcement & corrections program, there will not be separate sessions for police and correction personnel. All sessions will be held at the Public Safety and Education Training Center in Sykesville with a maximum capacity of 24 participants.

DPSCS SUPERVISOR ACADEMY (2 weeks)

This 10 day program is designed to provide first line supervisors within DPSCS the necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes to be highly successful in their positions. This program meets the training requirement for first-line supervisors in the Department. The program focuses on the development of first line supervisor competencies through self-assessment, group discussions, small group activities and peer coaching. The class is open to all first line supervisors (uniformed, non-uniformed, mandated and non-mandated).

The program is based on the most recent leadership research and focuses on the development of leader competencies through extensive self-assessment, self-reflection, group discussions, small group activities and peer coaching, all within the context of a project to be completed at the participant’s work site. Police Patrol Allocation and Workload Analysis Seminar is training that imparts skills and insights into the art and science of patrol workload analysis and resource allocation including: grouping and analyzing data; determining an optimum strategy for delivery of patrol services; computation of optimum levels of allocation; providing demand driven allocation; equalizing the workload/unit; designing the jurisdiction's patrol beats; computing the relief factor; and community policing concerns. This program is presented by a veteran command member who has conducted workload studies and deployed in excess of 1,100 uniformed police officers.

INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION TRAINING

FIELD TRAINING AND EVALUTION PROGRAM

Fee: \$75

Instructor: Charles Lewis

The transition from an entry – level academy to the “real” world is an essential step in any type of field training program. In the past, the training option that has primarily been available is the San Jose model. With the advent of community policing, the problem solving policing model of field training was introduced. The Field Training Program that is offered by the staff of MPCTC does not advocate either model. Instead it incorporates the best of both models in a manner that is realistic and applicable to the current environment.

Initially, the program examines the roles of the field training officer – specifically, the fact that the field training officer functions as the “supervisor” of a field trainee. The program also focuses on the fact that an FTO needs to possess and demonstrate skills in leadership and delegation. Additional components of the program instruct to the following:

- Fundamentals of effective communication;
- Counseling;
- The FTO as a trainer;
- The FTO as an evaluator; and,
- Training liability and legal issues.

The program is a combination of classroom instructor and practical application. During the daily practical applications, students will

- Apply leadership traits and principles to an FTEP Program / training situation;
- Introduce trainee to FTEP expectations and standards;
- Rehearse counseling skills;
- Prepare a remedial training plan for a specific problem; and,
- Review evaluation instruments.

This seminar is an 80-hour training that is designed to prepare a seasoned police officer to teach the D.A.R.E. Curriculum to the elementary level student in the classroom atmosphere. It is an entry-level training in the D.A.R.E. Program and is required by National Policy and Copyright Law in order to receive certification to present the curriculum.

LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING

POLICE ENTRANCE LEVEL TRAINING

Fee: \$2,500 (Does not include Ammo, Clothing or Lodging)

The Police Entrance Level Training Program is a 26-week, 1040-hour course of instruction for members of small and medium sized police agencies. The Police Academy curriculum incorporates community policing strategies with a strong emphasis on Scenario-Based Learning (SBL) activities throughout the training. The course serves officers from municipal police departments, county sheriffs' offices, school and university police departments and home detention units WHO DO NOT HAVE AN ENTRY LEVEL TRAINING PROGRAM. Instruction includes: organizational principles and law; patrol tactics; traffic laws and enforcements; criminal investigations; emergency medical care; radio communications; report writing and composition; crime prevention; crisis intervention; protective strategies and tactics; emergency vehicle operations; prisoner processing and security; courtroom preparation and testimony; health and wellness; terrorism and weapons of mass destruction; police officer firearms training and qualification. Each week is devoted to the problem-solving process to practical police problems.

There are labs where students individually or in teams can develop skills such as interpersonal communication, leadership, evidence collection, crime scene photography, fingerprinting, warrant applications, and relevant federal, state, and local police topical issues that may present themselves during their time at the Academy.

An outstanding academic feature of the Training Commission's PELT is the opportunity for graduates to obtain 30 college credits from Carroll Community College. This entry level program was conceived and designed as an affordable and accessible alternative for those smaller municipalities of Maryland Law Enforcement that are seeking an academically-innovative and adult learning-based approach to police recruit training. **Contact enrollment@pctc.state.md.us for more information.**

COMPARATIVE COMPLIANCE TRAINING COURSE

The Comparative Compliance Training Course is an abbreviated entrance level program designed for previously certified Maryland police officers who have been separated from law enforcement between 3 and 5 years, and non-Maryland officers who completed an acceptable entrance level academy in another state or through the federal government. This course will cover professional standards incorporating skills, and competencies expected of a member of a highly trained profession, by providing social networking tips and techniques.
